


harles Monroe Schulz brightened the world for 50 years with his *Peanuts* comic strip, which debuted October 2, 1950. With Snoopy, Charlie Brown, and the rest of the lovable *Peanuts* gang, Schulz explored the emotional territory of friendship, disappointment, faith, and tolerance. He was an artist and a storyteller who transformed images of everyday life into art that captured the humor, vulnerability, and dignity of the human spirit. Schulz once proclaimed, "It seems beyond the comprehension of people that someone can be born to draw comic strips, but I think I was."

The Life and Art of Charles M. Schulz explores Schulz's personal history and his role as the inspiration and artistic talent behind Peanuts and its unique cast of characters. The exhibition follows Schulz from his Minnesota roots to his life in California and tracks

the development of the characters that make up the unique world of *Peanuts*. Fifty-two original *Peanuts* comic strips, sketches, photographs, and elements representative of Schulz's studio illuminate the story behind the popular and influential cartoon strip. A range of ephemera, including books, memorabilia, and toys will also be on display.

### BORN TO BE A CARTOONIST

rowing up in the Twin Cities, *Peanuts* creator Charles Schulz lived for the Sunday comic strips. It was a simpler time far removed from the days of social media and 24-hour news cycles.

"Comic strips were the major entertainment media of the day," said Charles Schulz Museum Curator Benjamin Clark. "You had radio and comics, but that was about it and those were the things people were talking about at that time."

Schulz was inspired by comic strips from an early age and coupled with his natural gift for drawing, he knew that's what he wanted to do. Born in 1922 and a child of the Great Depression, pursuing a career as a cartoonist was not considered a noble career path.

"He was an only child, but his parents were super supportive and saw that he had a natural gift from a very early age," says Clark. "He was drawing very technical things, like depth, as early as kindergarten."

Primarily self-taught, Schulz had plenty of rejection as a cartoonist, but he eventually appeared in his hometown paper and even sold some single panels to *The Saturday Evening Post*. United Feature Syndicate (UFS) reached out in 1950 to ask him to develop the single panels as a strip and create some recurring characters.

Originally called *Lil' Folks*, UFS felt the name was too similar to other comic strip names and eventually renamed it *Peanuts*. And while Schulz felt like that was "the most undignified name ever given to a comic strip," he eventually made peace with new name, which then became the name of the most successful comic strip of all time.

A big part of what made–and continues to make–the comic strip so successful is the relatability of the *Peanuts* characters. Each character Schulz created became part of the *Peanuts* gang, and they were all relatable because Schulz had the ability to pull threads of himself into each of his characters. "He was filled with self-doubt like Charlie Brown, but was sarcastic like Lucy, an obsessed creative like Schroeder, and had ambition and flights of fancy like Snoopy," said Clark.


The characters served as a catalyst for simplifying the complexity of everyday life. Through the emotionally honest storylines, *Peanuts* became a world-wide pop culture phenomenon. And as the world evolved, the characters did as well in order to stay relevant, fresh, and relatable.

"Schulz had to find something funny and poignant every single day for 50 years," added Clark. "He had a very specific routine he followed during his 50-year career, and it was his priority to always do the strip himself with no assistance. He would start by doodling and then think about some phrases or words that stood out to begin his creative process."

In true Charlie Brown fashion, Schulz never could have imagined his success, but his rich legacy lives on for generations to come.




### **CONVERSATION WITH A COLLECTOR**



"I always liked Snoopy, but growing up in a small coal mining town in West Virginia, my exposure to *Peanuts* was limited to the local Hallmark store. Once I went to college and moved around more, I realized Snoopy and the *Peanuts* characters were everywhere. I joined the *Peanuts* Collector Club in 1993 and attended my first Beaglefest convention for collectors, which opened my eyes to the world-wide appeal of *Peanuts* collecting." - **OC Collector, Celia Maroudas** 

"My collection has grown to over 1,000 items, including holiday-themed items, kitchen things, puzzles, promotional items like Pepsi bottle caps from Japan, greeting cards, vintage items, a bronze sculpture of Snoopy signed by Charles Schulz that was created for the 50th anniversary of *Peanuts*, and hundreds of books in different languages. One of my favorite items is a 2010-piece Japanese puzzle that's framed of the characters walking around in Japan." - **Celia Maroudas**

# ANSEL ADAMS, THE SIERRA CLUB, AND THE MAKING OF A LANDSCAPE ICON

Katz Gallery, June 17 - August 27, 2023

This June, the Figge will present *Portfolio Three: Yosemite Valley*, a suite of images by the renowned photographer Ansel Adams. A San Francisco native, Adams (1902-1984) was arguably the most famous and influential American landscape photographer of the twentieth century. At the age of 26, Adams served as the Sierra Club's official trip photographer. Founded by John Muir (1838-1914), the Scottish American naturalist and environmental philosopher, the Sierra Club's initial mission was the preservation and conservation of California's Sierra Nevada, a mountain range located primarily in eastern central California. In his first role with the Club, Adams accompanied large groups of members on month long excursions in Yosemite–the Club's home–and in the surrounding Sierra Nevadas. First published in the *Sierra Club Bulletin*, his impressive images captured and promoted the natural beauty found in Yosemite. Portfolios of Adams's images were produced in several editions and sold to promote the Club's conservation efforts.

After the first photographs and paintings of Yosemite were made in the late 1840s, word of the valley's beauty spread more widely. In 1861, Carleton Watkins (1829-1916) aided by his mammoth-plate view camera created some of the best large format photographs of Yosemite to be seen on the East Coast. It was Watkins's images that helped to persuade the U.S. Government to establish Yosemite as the third National Park in 1890, after Yellowstone and Sequoia. Adams continued Watkin's legacy by making a body of breathtaking images, both intimate and grand, that inspired the preservation of some of this country's most beautiful and fragile lands. Of course, turning Yosemite into a National Park was not without its costs. In the mid-nineteenth century, state backed militias forcibly removed the Southern Sierra Miwok peoples from the area–including the Ahwahnee for whom the valley floor had been home for a millennium–to exploit Yosemite's natural resources. And, for the past century, the rapid increase in visitors to over three million annually has taxed the park's resources, threatening the very beauty they have come to see. In response, the Sierra Club along with members of the Mono Lake Paiute and Shoshone communities are taking the lead by proposing alternatives to the National Park Service's solution of paving paradise further. In this effort, photographs by Adams, and new generations of photographers, serve as reminders of Yosemite's iconic beauty and the perils it continues to face.

# EDOUARD DUVAL-CARRIÉ: ENDLESS FLIGHT

Fourth Floor Gallery, June 10 - September 17, 2023

orn in Port-au-Prince, and based in Miami, Edouard Duval-Carrié is a leading contemporary artist focusing on the multi-faceted nature of Haitian identity and culture. Duval-Carrié's impressive multi-part altarpiece, Endless Flight, contains dense imagery referencing Haitian spirituality, history, and politics. Created at a time of increased Haitian migration into the United States, the artwork casts central Voudou spirits, or lwa, as modern figures including a superhero, a stripper, and a soldier. The central wall of the altarpiece, echoing the architecture of a Catholic church, is accompanied by seven sculptural assemblages. These sculptures are in the form of ships and carts, and carry figures and symbols associated with Voudou spirits like Baron Samedi-the father of the spirits of the dead, and Erzulie Dantor -the goddess of love, motherhood, and vengeance. These vessels refer to the historical migration of colonists and enslaved Africans to Haiti as well as the modern migration of Haitians fleeing their country due to political turmoil and poverty. Endless Flight is a key work in the Figge's permanent collection and was acquired with the generous assistance of multiple donors. We are thrilled to share it once again with our community.

## IOWA NIGHT SKIES: PHOTOGRAPHS BY JOHNNY BRIAN Katz Gallery, June 17 - August 27, 2023

owa Night Skies features a dozen stunning pigment prints by Iowa City based photographer Johnny Brian. By exposing film over long periods, Brian captures the bustling sky from his backyard. With the Milky Way, comets and meteors, aircraft, satellites, and fireflies all streaking across the heavens, Brian's images reveal the details of the nightly drama taking place over our heads.

Brian is an accomplished large and medium format photographer and printer. Working primarily in black and white film, he develops and prints his negatives using traditional gelatin silver and gum bichromate processes. Brian's work has appeared in *Fraction Magazine's* 9th anniversary issue, and in the publication *Gum Printing: A Step by Step Manual* by Christina Anderson. His prints have been exhibited at the Soho Photo Gallery in New York as well as locally. Brian is a retired anesthesiologist with over forty years of experience in chemical and biomedical research.

### **NEW ACQUISITION** Jane Peterson

he Figge is pleased to announce the acquisition of an important work by painter Jane Peterson (1876-1965). The first work by this renowned early twentieth century artist to join the collection, A Quiet Harbor, Gloucester, circa 1915-20, demonstrates Peterson's masterful handling of oil paint in the flickering afternoon reflections of the distant houses and wharf on the harbor waters. One of the most accomplished female painters of her era, Peterson's ability to render light, anticipates the works of artists, such as Edward Hopperwho spent his career interpreting the effects of sunlight and shadow on architectural settings. In selecting the location of this subject, Peterson joined a distinguished roster of female and male artists who, for more than 300 years, had chosen the Cape Ann seacoastencompassing the Massachusetts towns of Gloucester, Rockport, Manchester by the Sea, and Ipswich-as their subject.

Born in Elgin, Illinois, Peterson demonstrated a talent for painting at an early age. In 1895, with her parents' encouragement, she traveled to New York to enroll at the Pratt Institute. At Pratt, Peterson studied with the influential artist and teacher Arthur Wesley Dow (1857-1922) whose other notable students would include Georgia O'Keeffe and Charles Sheeler. Upon graduation, Peterson taught in Brooklyn while continuing her studies at the Art Students League with painter Henry B. Snell. In 1907, Peterson sailed with Snell and his wife to Europe, where she was enthralled by the artistic opportunities she discovered while painting in England, Holland, France, and Italy. After a successful debut of her work in Boston in 1909, Peterson returned to Europe to study with Joaquin Sorolla y Bastida (1863-1923), the Spanish master whose influence would have the largest impact on her mature painting style. As her studies with Sorolla progressed, her palette became brighter and her brushwork more spontaneous and gestural, achieving the style which would become the hallmark of her best work. In 1910, so renowned was her work, that the Art Institute of Chicago featured her work in a one artist exhibition. Despite World War I, which temporarily ended Peterson's travels to study and paint abroad, the mid-1910s and early 1920s were productive for Peterson. She explored and painted throughout the country, making regular visits to the Massachusetts artists' colonies at Martha's Vineyard, Rockport, and Gloucester, as well as Ogunquit, Maine and continued to exhibit her work.

Her oil and watercolor paintings were included in prominent annual exhibitions at the National Academy of Design, the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts and the Corcoran Gallery in Washington, DC. Peterson was also active in prominent women's associations, joining both the National Association of Women Painters and Sculptors and The Group, a circle of six established female artists who exhibited nationally between 1917 and 1919. Earning numerous prizes throughout her career, Peterson's contribution to the advancement of American art was celebrated by the American Historical Society in 1938, when she was the second woman to be named "outstanding individual of the year" and by the Allied Artists of America, who presented her with the Testimonial Award in 1952.

Peterson's painting joins a lovely marine painting by another Illinois native, Irma René Koen–whose work *All on a Summer's Day* circa 1920s (A dock scene in Rockport, MA) was the subject of a Figge exhibition in 2017. The addition of this work demonstrates the Figge's commitment to collecting strong examples by female artists whose works equal or surpass those of their male contemporaries, further underscoring the significant contributions of female artists to the field over the centuries.

# DONOR SPOTLIGHT: STORIES OF GIVING AND IMPACT

A Heartfelt Tribute to Our Mothers

or Shaun and Vicki Graves, contributing to the Figge's Diversity, Equity, and Art Fund (DEAF) was a perfect way to memorialize their mothers, who both passed away in 2020, during the COVID-19 lockdowns. Without being able to have gatherings, it was hard to properly honor their mothers, who they were, and the effect they'd had on their families as well as their communities.

Shaun's mother Nancy always had a love for art. Living in Collinsville, Illinois, the Graves family spent a great deal of time at the St. Louis Art Museum when Shaun was growing up. Shaun's parents, Nancy and Dean, collected art and got to know many artists through travel and art shows. The Cahokia Mounds would host a large gathering of Native American artists each year; and they became good friends with many of the artists, hosting them at backyard barbecues.

As a teacher of gifted students, Nancy used art in the classroom to inspire students' curiosity and creativity. Because of her own kind and curious character, she embraced everyone; she just liked people and who they were, she always wanted to know more about what made them make art.

Vicki's mother Margaret Farrar was also a teacher; she was an elementary school teacher at Monroe in Davenport and later at Lincoln in Moline. Growing up in the Quad Cities, the Farrar family made many trips to the Davenport Museum of Art, and they always felt a special connection to the Haitian art collection. Margaret visited Haiti during the country's travel boom in the 1950s. Having grown up in small towns in Iowa, this was her first exposure to a tremendously different culture. She loved it and would have enjoyed the Figge's upcoming exhibition, featuring Haitian artist Edouard Duval-Carrié.

Working at John Deere, Vicki has valued the attention that has been paid over the years to ensuring that John Deere's art collection is globally representative. Shaun and Vicki believe that John Deere and the Figge Art Museum are great examples of organizations that are committed to their communities and to the many aspects of human ingenuity and expression.

Since its creation in July 2021, the Figge's DEAF has helped the museum acquire many outstanding artworks by artists from marginalized and underrepresented communities, including works from Edward Bannister, Elizabeth Catlett, Kehinde Wiley, LaToya M. Hobbs, Anthony White, and Jane Peterson. The fund's ongoing mission is to acquire and preserve artworks for the Figge's permanent collection that represent artists from underserved and marginalized groups, including Black artists, artists of African, Native American, Hispanic, Latinix, Asian, Pacific Island, Indigenous, and Middle Eastern descent as well as works from women, LBGTQA+, and any other artists that are subsequently identified as marginalized, oppressed, or underrepresented in the museum's permanent collection.


# MASTERS OF THE CRAFT: FIGGE INSTRUCTORS



### Laura Warner

**True Story:** I've had my motorcycling license since 1994; and my current ride is a pearl Ducati Monster 796 with red trim. I also live in a geodesic dome! So, it's round; and the ceiling starts sloping in at about 4ft. And let me tell you, there are few corners to send your children to when they're naughty in a round house.

**My Art History:** I was always an art kid and knew from a young age that it was my passion. When I realized it could be a career path, I went to college for graphic design and art education before working as a graphic designer for about a decade. After having children, I chose to stay at home, but after a 20-year maternity leave, I went back to school to get a second degree in fine arts and art education, which set the stage for me to be where I am today.



**Favorite Medium:** It depends on my mood; and it depends on what I am trying to communicate. Sometimes I'm feeling very tactile, and I want to build, I want to sculpt or carve. But I enjoy drawing and painting as well. I love color, and I love building up values so that it becomes something that feels three-dimensional even though it's on a two-dimensional plane.

**Classes I Teach at the Figge:** I teach several classes, including a daytime drawing class that shifts focus each month, clay classes, painting classes, Raku, a class for artists with special needs, summer camp classes, and more!

**Best Art Class for Beginners:** That's a hard one because there are so many great classes here at the Figge. But, If you like squishy, tactile things, then our Pottery Wheel 1 class would be good for you; if you don't like getting messy, then I would suggest a drawing class because they are cleaner; and if you like color, if you're motived by color, then painting is for you!

**Take a Class with Me:** Art is for everyone. Within a classroom, everyone brings their own experiences with them, and no two people have the same experiences. We honor that by meeting people where they are so that they can have a meaningful and successful art experience.



### **David R. Anderson**

**True Story:** I was drafted during the Vietnam War; and when I went to the induction center, I made the decision to join the Marine Corps and ended up being selected to be a combat artist. There were four other combat artists in the program. We had the freedom to go anywhere we wanted in Vietnam and our mission was to capture in art all the activities that the Marine Corps was involved in. We'd sketch and take photos, finalizing our work in a Da Nang studio, and then once a month, we'd ship the artwork back to Washington D.C. where it would be catalogued and offered to the Pentagon. Recruiters would use it for shows around the country, and even the Smithsonian did a show featuring our work.

**My Art History:** I started teaching art about seven years ago, but I've been making art my entire life, including during my 33-year career as Creative Director in the advertising department at John Deere.



**Art Inspiration:** I love finding the beauty in the outdoors, especially in the things that surround me but are often overlooked. The Mississippi River, for example, is a fixture in the Quad Cities, but the same location may look and feel completely different depending on the time of day, the season, and shifts in sunlight.

**Classes I Teach at the Figge:** I teach oil painting every Saturday year-round. Students can join my class starting any Saturday of their choice for four weeks at a time.

**Take a Class with Me:** Painting is much simpler than people may think. Once the process is broken down into shapes and there is an understanding about the relationship between light and dark and value and color, the rest is about finding an emotional connection with what you are painting.


